

SCIBS first wave

Sanctuary Cove International Boat Show is ready for a blockbuster of a year when it returns from 19 to 22 May with a show-stopping line-up of exhibitors.

With a 25,000-square-metre showcase dedicated to trailer boats to meet increased demand, more premium inclusions and additional covered display space on water, Sanctuary Cove International Boat Show (SCIBS) – the Southern Hemisphere’s marquee marine event – has already attracted record exhibitors. As official media partner, Ocean Media will celebrate its 18th year of exhibiting at SCIBS, which is timely given the first issue of *Ocean* magazine was launched at SCIBS in 2005.

Premium brands on the water include Riviera, Princess Yachts, Palm Beach, Maritimo, Horizon, Alexander Marine, Integrity, Whitehaven, Eyachts, Fleming, Beneteau, Axopar, Lagoon and Iliad.

Trailerable boats, water sports and inflatable craft will also have a prominent presence, and the latest marine gear, gadgets and tech will also be on display.

Peerless skyline

The latest Horizon FD75 is the first of the entry-level Fast Displacement (FD) model to be built for experienced Australian owners and the first to be delivered to the continent. The yacht will feature the first Skyline enclosed skylounge configuration for the model.

The owners specified a three-cabin layout comprising the semi on-deck, full-beam master with two large full-beam guest cabins on the lower deck. They were heavily involved in the design process,



and worked with both the Horizon Yacht Australia (HYA) team and the yard’s in-house design centre to execute a modern interior that draws on Acacia wood and Michelangelo marble throughout.

A spacious aft deck with dining table flows into the main saloon, which features L-shaped social seating plus a large dining area and a country kitchen. There is a spacious laundry on the lower deck.

A beach club with a lounge area and day head resides aft of the engine room. A floating interior staircase in the main saloon leads to the enclosed skylounge, which features a helm with three fixed chairs and a comfortable window-side lounge with day head nearby. The large open boat deck offers plenty of space for entertaining with tender storage aft. Settees for relaxing and sunbathing are positioned on the foredeck. horizonyacht.com horizonyachtaus.com.au
